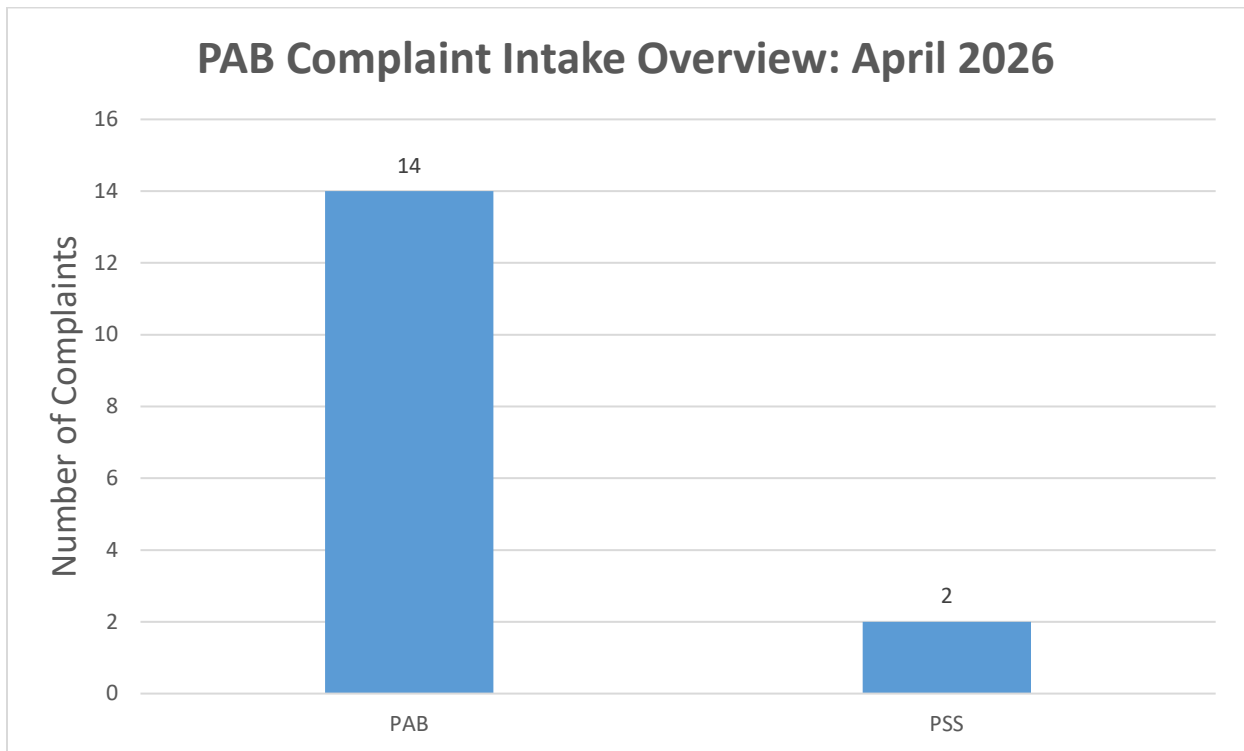


# Public Accountability & Transparency Dashboard

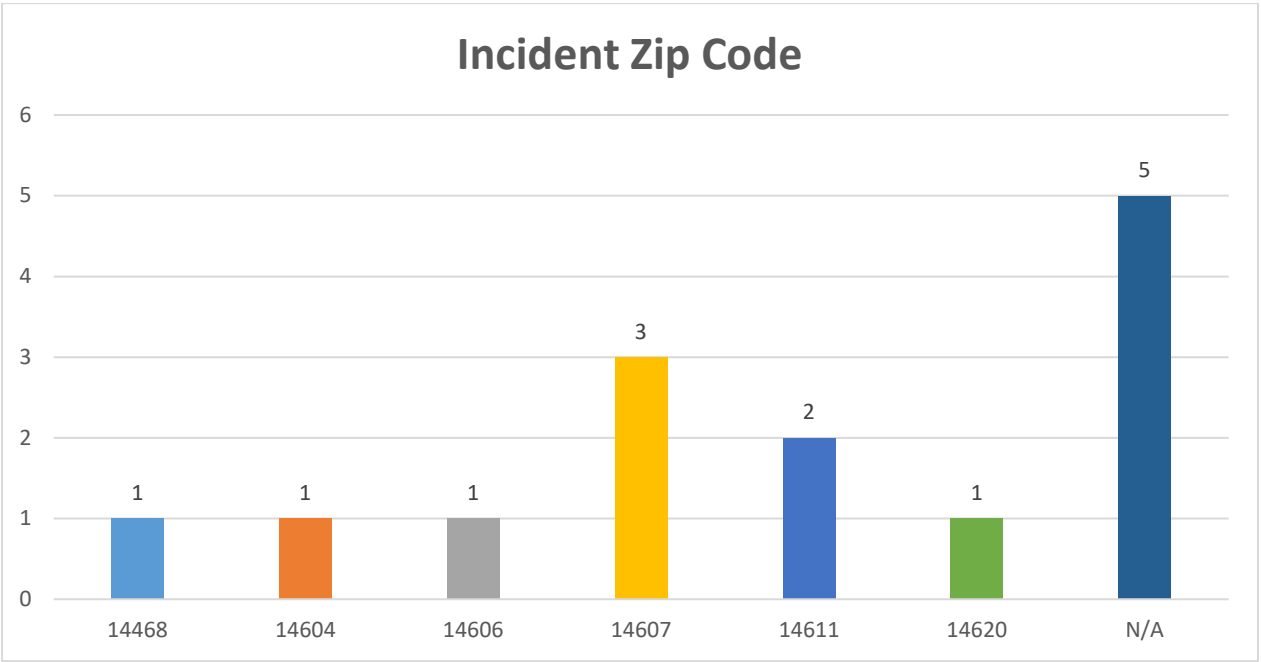
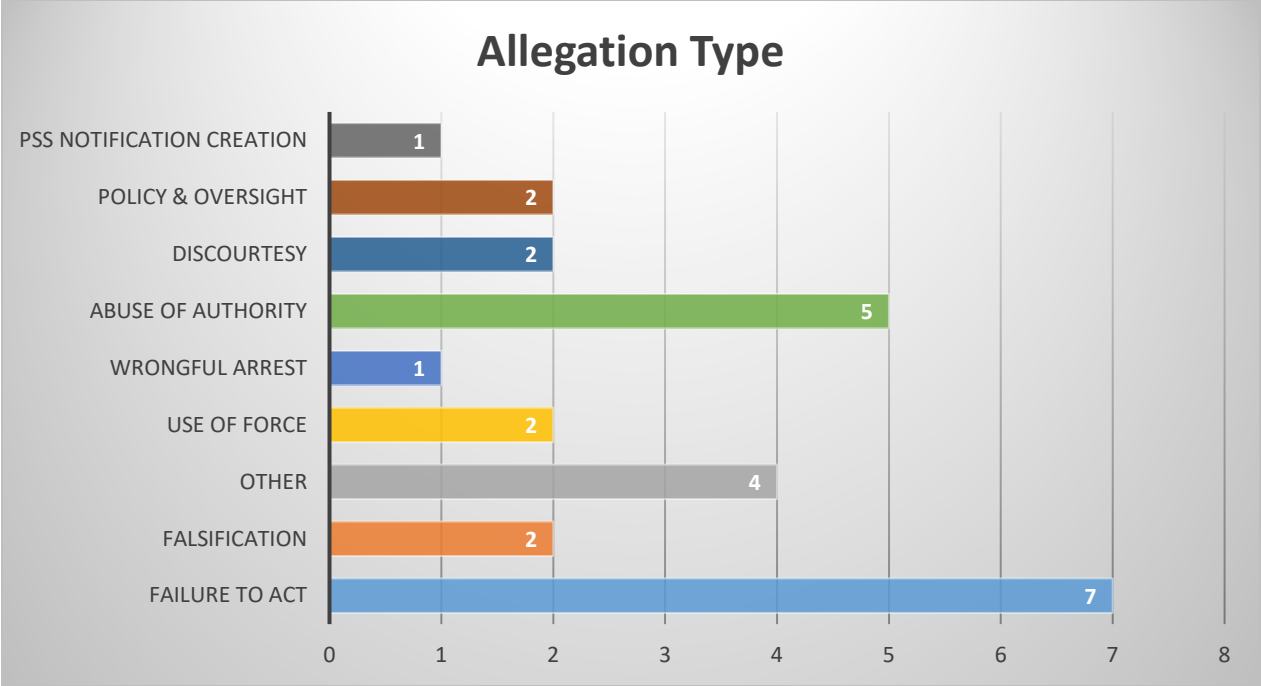
The Police Accountability Board’s Public Accountability Dashboard is designed to provide the community with greater transparency into the complaints received by the PAB and the trends emerging from those complaints. While the PAB’s investigatory authority changed following the April 28, 2025 court ruling, complaints remain critically important to identifying patterns, informing policy recommendations, strengthening public accountability, and advancing systemic reform. This dashboard represents the PAB’s commitment to becoming a more data-driven, transparent, and publicly accessible oversight agency. Through monthly reporting, demographic analysis, geographic trends, allegation tracking, and public insight reporting, we aim to ensure that community concerns continue to be seen, documented, analyzed, and elevated. This is the first phase of the dashboard and additional interactive features, enhanced reporting capabilities, and expanded data analysis tools will continue to be added over time as we strengthen our public transparency efforts.



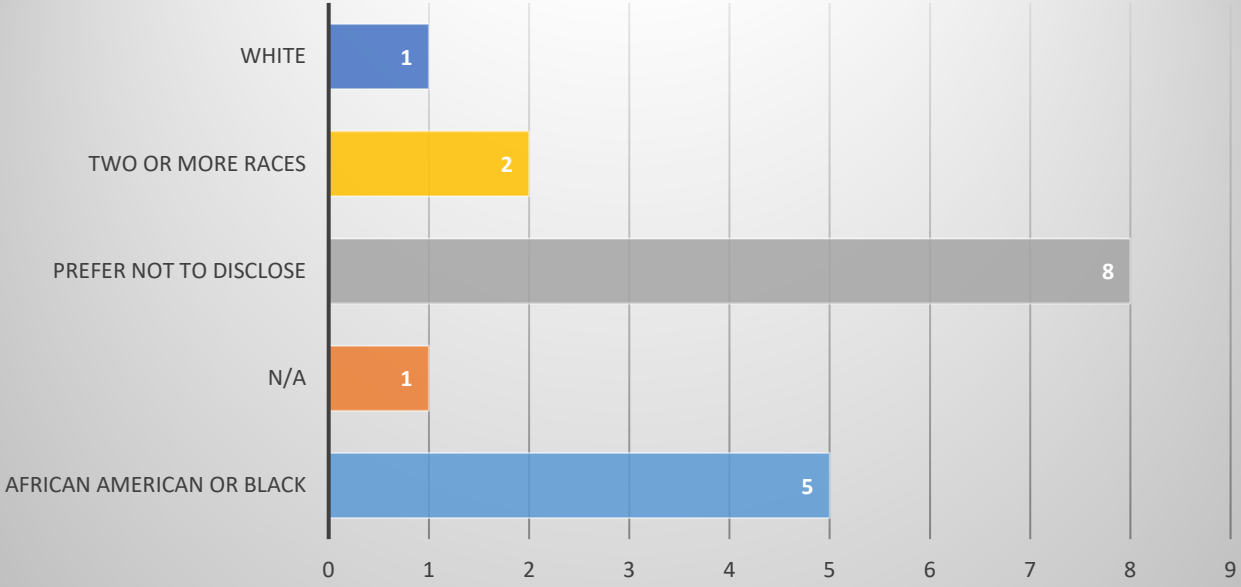
\*Note: Of the 14 complaints received by the PAB in April 2026, 2 were referred by the Rochester Police Department Professional Standards Section (PSS).

“PSS Notification” refers to civilian complaints submitted to RPD’s Professional Standards Section and then transmitted to PAB.

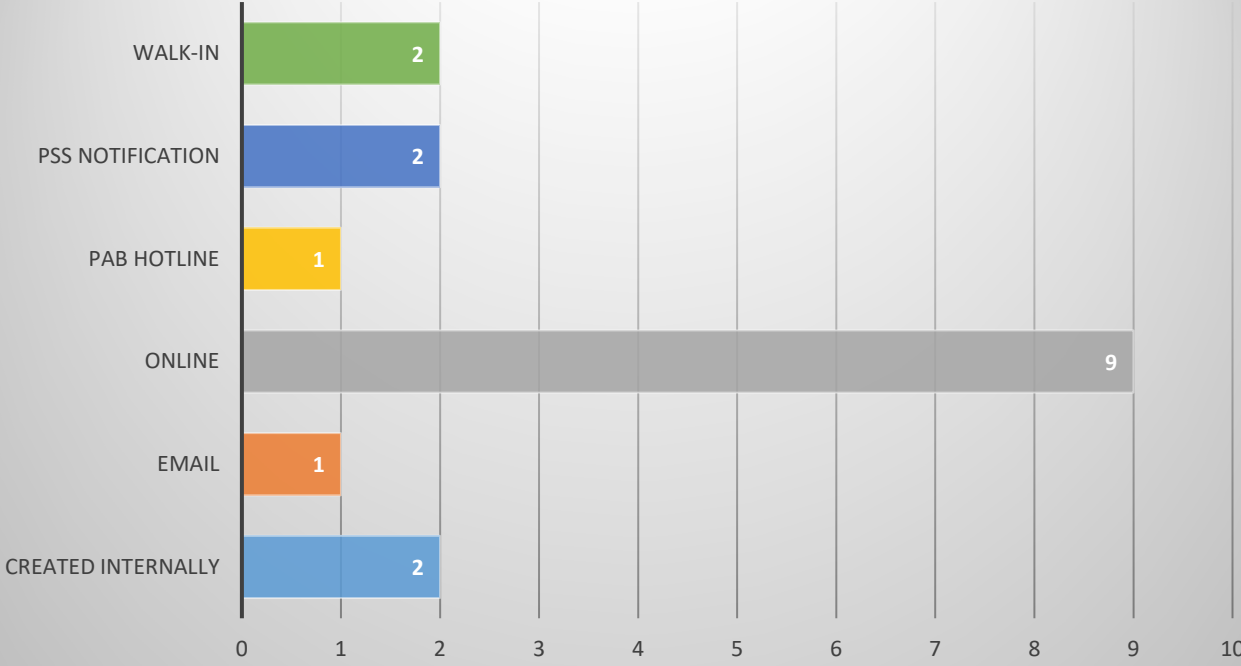

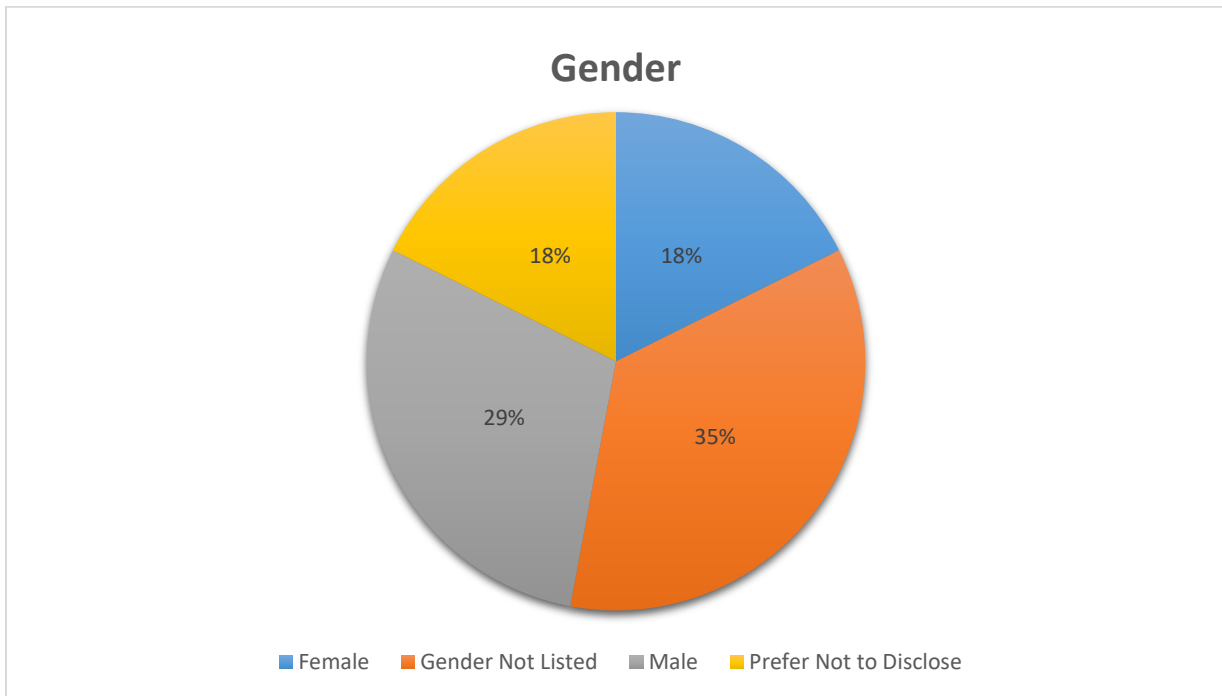
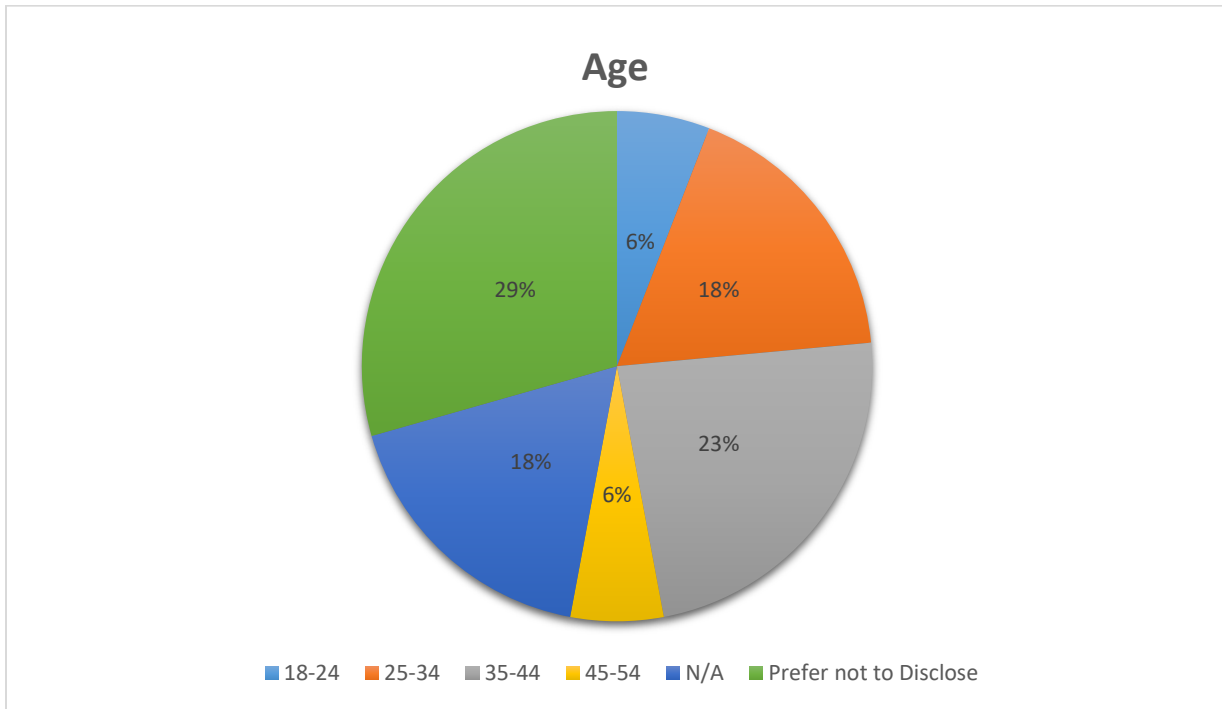
### Count of Race/Ethnicity



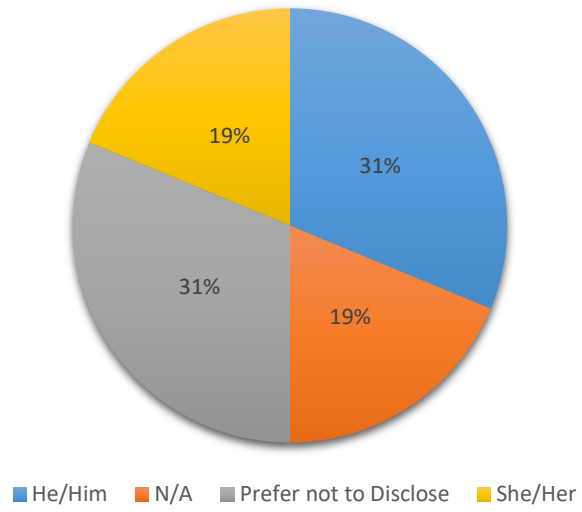
