3. Executive Director's Report (7:02 PM)

- Community Engagement & Public Input:
 - o 911 Call-to-Arrival Survey:
 - Launched on the PAB's website (rocpab.org).
 - Nearly 80 responses received so far.
 - The Executive Director and Sofia Lopez Cartagena (Bilingual Data Analyst) conducted an interview with Spectrum News about the survey and response time disparities.
 - Board members and public encouraged to share survey widely.
 - Community Listening Sessions scheduled:
 - September 10 Frederick Douglass Art Center (6–8 PM).
 - October 14 Ibero Community Resource Room (6–8 PM).
 - Purpose: gather community stories, feedback, and recommendations; and to foster transparency and trust.
 - Youth Engagement:
 - PAB presentations scheduled for secondary schools and St. John Fisher University.
 - Goal: educate youth on their rights and oversight role in public safety.
 - Participation in the Statewide & External Engagement:
 - September 15 NYCLU Statewide Panel:
 - Focus: Panel discussion featuring legal experts, reporters and advocates to discuss the fight to advance police transparency and accountability in New York, five years after the repeal of 50-a.
 - September 30 NYS Civilian Oversight Consortium hosted by the PAB:
 - Participation of 8 oversight agencies statewide.

• Board Transition:

- Bid farewell to Rabbi Setel, recognizing her outstanding courage, compassion, and dedicated service to both the board and the community.
- Extended a warm welcome to AJ Durwin, an attorney and former staff member who has joined the board and will be present at the next board meeting.

• Staff Development:

- o Staff Undoing Racism Training (a 3-day program) scheduled for staff.
- Ongoing workspace improvements at 57 St. Paul office; move expected by the end of this year or the beginning of next year.

• Legal Update:

- Reiterated that the April 2025 court ruling revoked the PAB's authority to independently investigate complaints, however, the PAB remains empowered to:
 - Conduct policy-level oversight.
 - Lead transparency initiatives.
 - Engage actively in community outreach.
 - Publish proposals for change.
 - Advance accountability through data.

• Website and Public Visibility:

- Increased website and social media traffic, especially during survey launches and public forums.
- Recent and upcoming press coverage has focused on listening sessions and community forums, reinforcing our visibility, presence, and accessibility to the public.

• Discussion: Meeting Venue Change:

 PAB to begin holding board meetings in City Council chambers for better technology/streaming quality through WXXI.

- Concerns were raised about perception of independence if meetings are held at City Hall.
- Agreement to trial the move, reassess based on community feedback after one year.

• PAB Community Survey Presentation (Kevin Stewart):

- Key Findings
 - 66% believe Rochester is not doing enough for police accountability.
 - 52% have direct proximity to perceived police misconduct.
 - 68% support PAB having disciplinary authority.
 - 75% support public release of investigative reports.
 - 71% are unfamiliar with the PAB complaint process.
 - 40%+ are interested in attending PAB events but need more information.
 - 17% hesitate to file complaints due to fear of retaliation.

Action Plan Initiatives

- Advancing Accountability & Transparency through Strategic Engagement and Operational Transparency
 - Reengage the Police Accountability Board Alliance (PABA).
 - Share survey findings with elected officials and policymakers.
 - Demonstrate consistent impact across all departments.
- Strengthening Public Trust Strategic Engagement
 - Expand community engagement efforts.
 - Engage external stakeholders with a unified message.
- Bridging the Knowledge Gap in Complaint Reporting
 - Refine and streamline the iSight complaint portal.
 - Integrate complaint process education into public presentations.
 - Increase community engagement focused on complaint awareness.
- Expanding Equity in Engagement
 - Build deeper relationships through on-the-ground presence.
 - Improve accessibility with translated and simplified materials.
 - Use targeted media to reach underserved populations.
 - Partner with schools and youth organizations.
- Activating Community Curiosity into Civic Engagement
 - Use a district-based approach for events and partnerships.
